3 073-22 Election of Deputy Mayor

5 075-22 Town Councillor Vacancy

The resignation of Cllr. P. Edwards was duly noted and it was resolved to thank Councillor Edwards for his service to the Town Council. The Clerk will report this resignation to the Elections Office of Herefordshire Council so a notice inviting the public to request an election can be prepared. If no such request is received within the specified time, the Town Council will be free to co-opt to fill the vacancy.

7 077-22 Public Participation

a) Police Report

12 083-22 Clerk's Report

The Clerk's report as attached to these Minutes was noted.

13 084-22 Financial Matters

a) Festival Grant

In accordance with the agreement for the award of the Festival Grant by Herefordshire Council (resolution 174-21 refers), it was resolved to delegate authority to the Clerk to place orders for expenditure of the Festival Grant up to the grant amount of £2,500 in total in accordance with the wishes of the Chamber of Trade provided that the requirements of the financial regulations are met and that a report be provided to Full Council in due course.

b) Shop Front Grant Scheme payments

Payments as listed on the attached payment schedule in accordance with agreed amounts under the Shop Front Grant Scheme were approved.

c) Grant to Kington Tourist Group

Approval was given for the payment of £2,500.00 as a grant to Kington Tourist Group.

d) Payments

Invoices totalling £6,782.13 (excl. VAT), including shop front grants as agreed above, noted on the attached schedule were approved for payment.

e) Amounts received

Members noted receipt of £58,750.00 being the first instalment of the precept for 2022-2023. Also noted was receipt of a credit note of £30.14 being a low claims rebate from insurers for year 2021-2022.

f) Bank signatories

It was agreed to add Cllr. D. Redmayne to the list of those authorised to sign cheques and instructions for payment on the Town Council bank accounts. In all other respects the terms of the existing bank mandate would remain as before.

h) Great Places to Visit funded activities

a) Map Project

Members noted the latest draft of the map design and content and subject to some small amendments, agreed the final draft design.

Cllr. Redmayne reported on how the QR codes on the map would be populated. He will meet with those responsible for content later this month and report back to the Council at the next meeting.

The unveiling of the map, suggested as being on Friday 4th June, was discussed with authority delegated to the Mayor and deputies plus the Clerk to make the necessary arrangements.

b) Planter Project

Councillor Cooke reported that the new planters are now being placed in their locations and will soon be planted up.

c) Shop Front Grant Scheme

The Clerk reported that an extension to the deadline for submission of claims under the shop front grant scheme might be possible and she has requested an extension to end August but currently awaits confirmation that this can be agreed by Herefordshire Council and HM Government.

i) Green Spaces Grant

Members noted that installation of the outdoor gym equipment has now commenced and should be completed within the next 48 hours.

14 085-22 Policies

It was agreed that the Scrutiny Committee be requested to review town council policies and procedures with a view to making recommendations for amendments to Full Council at a later date.

15 086-22 Kington in Bloom

Members considered options for the maintenance of the new planters around the town and agreed to accept the quotation from the contractor currently supplying the planters at a cost of £500.00 per month for an estimated growing season from May to October, covering a total of 21 planters.

16 087-22 Queen's Platinum Jubilee Activities

a) Planned activities

Cllr. Macleod-Needs reported on activities planned for the Jubilee by the Town Council, Chamber of Trade and others, including:

- Lighting of the beacon at the Golf Club on Thursday 2nd June
- Unveiling of the town map on Friday 3rd June
- Summer Food Festival on Saturday 4th June, and
- Church Service followed by a bring your own picnic in the Recreation Ground on Sunday 5th June.

In addition, the Chamber of Trade are running a window dressing competition in the run up to the Jubilee and other organisations are also holding events. A single poster will be created listing all the other activities to be posted on social media over the next few weeks.

b) Grant Request

A request from Kington Chamber of Trade for a grant of £500.00 was agreed to cover incidental expenses for the picnic on the recreation ground, including provision of activities for children.

17 088-22 Market Towns Maintenance Fund

Members noted that the proposals as agreed have been put to Herefordshire Council/Balfour Beatty and we await a report from them on feasibility and/or agreement to the request.

18 089-22 Herefordshire BID

The Clerk reported that town councils are able to join the Herefordshire BID company at a cost of £240.00 which would also entitle the town councils to appoint one representative director of the company, representing all town councils. Members questioned the value of joining the company and agreed to defer a decision until further information is available.

19 090-22 Reports from Committees

It was noted that neither the planning committee or services committee had met during April due to the Easter break.

Cllr. R. Banks reported on the meeting of the Finance & General Purposes Committee held on 25th April 2022 and noted that a copy of the minutes is available on the town council website.

20 091-22 Information Exchange

The Clerk reminded members that in accordance with the Local Government Act 1974 only subjects listed on the agenda can be discussed or agreed in a meeting with the result that this item is for information only and items raised for discussion would be placed on the relevant council or committee agenda for discussion or decision.

Following the Covid lockdowns the revival of the civic events calendar has been slow. Apart from the 6 weekly Mayors' meeting hosted by the Chair of Herefordshire Council there have been few civic events held although gradually things are returning to normal and the year ahead is likely to be much busier.

Notable events in my calendar over the last year have been:

- The 6 weekly meetings of market town mayors hosted by the chair of Herefordshire. Also attending are deputy mayors and clerks.
- Herefordshire Council civic service at St. Mary's Kington on September 26th 2021.
- Herefordshire Shrievalty service at Hereford Cathedral on October 15th 2021.
- Walkers are Welcome meet Kington October 29th 2021.
- The visit of the High Sheriff, Jo Hilditch, to Kington on October 22nd.
- The Platinum Jubilee service at Herefordshire Cathedral on February 6th 2022.
- Tree planting at Lady Hawkins Schools as a contribution to the Queen's Green Canopy marking the Platinum Jubilee.
- Chairing the meetings of festivals to develop the Festivals Brochure as part of our Welcome Back funding.

In recent months I have been limited in what I can do both by a disability and subsequent operation and I would like to record my thanks to the deputy mayors, Cllrs E. Banks and Fitton, for covering for me and to Emma Hancocks, who as a member of the Jubilee working group has picked up the load in planning for the event and also for her work in helping us to deliver the festivals promotion brochure.

The mayor and deputy mayors are de facto members of all council committees. I think this is of value and I would not propose changing this but in the past I have raised concerns that poor attendance by other councillors often means that the onus is on them to attend every meeting to ensure that they are quorate adding to an already large workload that comes with the post.

The year 2021/22 has been a highly productive year for the council with the additional funding that has been available and successful bids we have made e.g. outdoor gym. At times it has been exhausting and I would like to congratulate and thank everyone for successfully delivering some real town improvements.

Above all I wish to thanks our clerk, Liz Kelso, for her support to me as mayor, for guiding us all through the funding maze and for her invaluable contribution in ensuring successful outcomes.

Kington Town Council Meeting held 9th May 2022 Appendix 4 Clerk's Report

This report identifies activities of the Clerk since the last meeting other than those addressed elsewhere on the agenda or addressed by other Members as part of their report and includes some items which are for information.

1. Town Council meetings

As most will be aware, the legal restrictions relating to the Coronavirus Pandemic have been lifted meaning that the wearing of masks and social distancing in public places (including public meetings) is no longer a legal requirement, as is the requirement for self isolation if you test positive for Coronavirus. Free lateral flow tests are also to be phased out. Clearly this has implications for council and committee meetings but does not remove the requirement under Health and Safety legislation to provide a safe working environment for staff and volunteers working on behalf of the Town Council and/or Recreation Ground Trust. Accordingly, Members, staff and members of the public are asked not to attend meetings if unwell.

2. Town Council offices

For the immediate future the Town Council offices will also remain closed to casual visitors but anyone wishing to visit the office is asked to make an appointment to do so. Not only does this avoid distractions but helps to ensure a safe working environment for staff or volunteers working alone in the office and, importantly, avoids a wasted visit if the office is unmanned.

3. Code of Conduct Statement of Financial Interests

Members are reminded that any change in matters reported in the Statement of Financial Interests must be notified to the Monitoring Officer within 28 days of the change. Failure to do so could, in some circumstances, incur criminal penalties. If you are unsure whether you need to include something on the form, please check with the Monitoring Officer or ask the Clerk. Copies of your existing form/declaration can be obtained from the Clerk.

4. Kington Business Summit
