Important Changes to Red Tractor Beef and Lamb Standards

As of 1^{st} June 2018 you will be assessed against new Red Tractor Beef and Lamb standards, relating to antibiotic use on farm. These amendments reflect the industry's commitment to being responsible users of antibiotics. In brief, members will be required to work with their vet to review health and performance data. The review must be written down, and there is a template for the vet to fill in – please click here.

This review includes looking at medicine records and prescription data that outlines total antibiotic use, to make recommendations as to where farms can use antibiotics as responsibly as possible.

Other changes include the use of Highest Priority Critically Important Antibiotics and recommendations for disease prevention strategies.

Nuffield Farming Scholarships 2018

Farming is about to face the biggest change for generations. Do you want to be at the front end of those changes?

Since the 1947 Agricultural Act there have been many changes in the way UK farming has had to adapt and over that period several hundred Nuffield Farming Scholars, including over twenty from Herefordshire, have scoured the world for ideas, opportunities and

innovations which have helped UK famers to become more proficient.

A Nuffield scholarship is an 'international passport' for global travel which opens doors not usually open and scholars become members of a vast international net-work. No formal post school educational qualifications are required by applicants.

With the imminent changes to the support mechanisms post Brexit, the new era will entail new thinking to counter the loss of CAP support. It will require new approaches related to productivity, volatility, profitability and sustainability, coupled to the envisaged swing towards a more environmentally oriented support system.

When Lord Nuffield established the Nuffield Farming Scholarships in the immediate post war period of food shortages, he did so to enable farmers and others involved in the food chain to seek out ideas world-wide which would help farmers increase food production. Post Brexit the industry will need a new approach to be able to react in a positive way to new scenarios including how to face volatility and how to react to support systems based on environmental payments.

So history will be repeating itself and there will be a need once again to scour the world for new approaches, innovations and new market opportunities.

Are you going to be one of those people between 25 and 45 years old, who would like to go out into the world to gather information and ideas? If so apply for a Nuffield Farming Scholarship. Applications must be in by late July.

Help with grassland assessment for Mid-Tier Grassland Options

There are a few places left on some of our training days for grassland farmers who'd like to develop wild plant ID skills. Go to www.herefordshiremeadows.org.uk for details and booking instructions – or ask to go on a waiting list if the date you'd like is already fully booked.

Several of the Mid-Tier Stewardship grassland options need evidence of the range and abundance of flowering plants in the sward to be submitted with the application before the end of July:

- GS2 and GS5 Permanent grassland with very low inputs (outside or in SDAs) 9 species / m2
- GS6 Management of species rich grassland (previously only available in Higher Tier fields also need to be registered on the Priority Habitat Inventory) 15 species / m2

RDPE Countryside Productivity Scheme

Funding for projects in England which improve productivity in the farming & forestry sectors & help create jobs and growth in the rural economy. It is administered by the RPA. Under the RDPE Countryside Productivity Scheme, there are grants for:

- Water resource management and reservoirs (application deadline 29th June 2018)
- Adding value to Agri-food products (application deadline 29th June 2018)
 Grants to fund projects that improve the processing of primary agricultural products (i.e. Annex I products), benefiting the Agri-food supply chain which will in turn improve farm productivity.
- Improving Farm Productivity (application deadline 3rd December 2018)

 Grants to fund projects that improve farm productivity through the use of robotic equipment and systems to aid crop and livestock production; increasing the use of renewable energy produced on farm; the use of LED wavelength controlled lighting to aid crop production; more efficient use of livestock slurries and manures, and digestate.

The RDPE grants are made by the European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD), which is part of the European Structural Investment Funds (ESIF).

The Prince's Countryside Fund

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a rurally based career to the end of December 2019. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim 70% of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of £250. Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).

The fund will support training that will; *improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.*

The appraisal panel meets on the first Monday of the month. Please ensure that you submit your application in good time before your course is due to take place, as training cannot be funded retrospectively.

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

The Jack Hughes Fund will fund up to a maximum of 70% pf the cost of training or costs up to a maximum of £150. Funding will be limited to one family member/employee per annum

The programme will be available for farmers <u>aged over 40</u> and will specifically provide funds to support those who require:

- retraining or upskilling as they are leaving the industry
- training to support a new farm diversification enterprise
- training or business support for succession planning

Funding will also be available for the following courses:

- Safe use of pesticides PA1, PA2, PA6
- Rodent control on farms
- · Emergency first aid
- Food safety (Basic Food Hygiene)
- Chainsaw Maintenance & Cross Cutting (CS30)

The funding is easy to access, but please note that the project will not support training retrospectively &places will be limited.
