Date set:	October/November 2015
We undertook :	*High visibility patrols *Request the community to keep reporting *Deal robustly with youths involved *Prosecute for any offences noted. Evening patrols carried out by the safer neighbourhood team with a view to disrupting this behaviour, identifying persons responsible and dealing with them accordingly. October and November regular high visibility patrols have been conducted in the area of Weobley paying particular attention to the schools and housing estates. Priority extended due to issues of damage and anti social behaviour in the area.

(Please note that the below is not every incident/crime reported for Kington Safer Neighbourhood Team)

Sarnesfield:

Incident 0460S 311015 Theft

Person/s have made their way to remote and isolated farm grounds located along the side of the main A4112 with no surrounding properties - only fields. They have then proceeded to an outlying yard not far from main farmyard and managed to locate a tractor powered generator which had been left outside in the main yard tucked behind one of the farm buildings. It seems that offenders have used appropriate means (possibly using a hydraulic hiab / crane) to remove generator from situ and place it into / onto a mode of transportation. Offender(s) have then made off from scene with the property. 'Ringrose' Genetract MK11 tractor powered generator (not run on fuel), measures approx 1 1/2 metres long x 600/700 wide x 800/900 tall, 45KVA, green in colour - green frame and faded green engine, original frame - although custom built frame also attached with a galvanised metal sheet covering the electrics.

Norton Canon:

<u>Incident 0159S 251015 – Theft of motor vehicle.</u>

Between the 24th and 25th of October 2015 victim is reporting that his White Ford Transit double cab tipper registration number: NJ57 YKS stolen from outside his home address where it was parked on the driveway.

The vehicle has "Ross Tree Services" written on the sides.

Lyonshall:

Incident 742S 241015 - Theft

Honda quad bikes in red which was situated on a trailer have been stolen from a property in Lyonshall.

The trailer is high sided galvanised metal measuring 8' by 4'.

A news alert was sent out at the time of the crime being reported I have included another picture below.

For many older people in Herefordshire, a driving licence provides independence, the ability to keep in touch with friends and attend social events. We are committed to helping people to retain their independent mobility while remaining safe on the road.

However, with increasing age many people start to lose confidence in their driving abilities. They may find that their eyesight, hearing and judgement are not as sharp as they used to be. Also, our roads are constantly changing - they are becoming busier with larger and faster vehicles.

Some practical driver training can help to increase confidence, improve driving skills and reduce the risk of being involved in a collision.

We offer drivers who live in Herefordshire and are aged 70 or over a two hour practical driving session with an approved driving instructor, in their own vehicle. It will only cost you £10 - Herefordshire Council will pay the remainder of the fee.

Scams

The following is a message sent out by one of my colleagues in Leominster in his briefing recently...

A NHW Coordinator has made us aware of a scam email that has appeared. As is quite common, the email tells you that you have 'potentially' won a prize such as a gift voucher. In this case, if you go through the replying process and tick the 'over 18' box on the reply message you agree to a £0.90p per minute charge to your phone, up to the sum of £30.00. Not only this but by ticking this box you are also agreeing to forfeit a 14 day cooling off period.

The advice with emails of this nature is simple. If it looks too good to be true, it probably is. Delete these messages and do not respond to them and certainly do not give away any personal details.
